



The Lea Nursery School

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Report on children receiving Early Years' Pupil Premium in the year 2016-2017

During the financial year 2016-2017, Lea Nursery School received £4341 as funding for Pupil Premium children. The purpose of the funding was to enable disadvantaged children to make accelerated progress.

The Narrowing the Achievement Gap Co-Ordinator has oversight over these children and works with staff in order to ensure that these children make the best possible progress.

At the beginning of the year all children who started as Rising 3's were considered Pupil Premium children. Through the course of the year the definition was refined to include only the 6 Nursery aged children who qualified for Pupil Premium funding.
