Dear Parents and Carers

Firstly, the staff, governors and I would like to thank you for your ongoing support and dedication to Lea Nursery School.

Secondly, **we appreciate and are thankful for all the fruit contributions you have made this year,** allowing your children to enjoy snack time. This is an important time in the day where children have the opportunity to develop their: fine motor skills; understanding of healthy eating; knowledge of fruit (where it comes from and how it grows); speaking; listening and social skills (including developing and understanding relationships with others).

In addition to the above, we are pleased to announce (on the following page) some exciting events we have planned in March and would encourage you to mark these in your diary.

So far this term your children have been given a wide variety of learning opportunities ensuring that they are given the best possibility of achieving their full potential through role play they have experienced life at the supermarket, hospital, doctors, dentist, vets and health and wellbeing centre.

Your child has also been learning about multicultural events including different spring festivals and Lunar New Year. You can find a small selection of photos celebrating your children's learning at the end of the newsletter.

Some notes for next term:

- Lost Property: To help us reduce the amount of lost property please could we ask you to name your child's clothing. Fabric pens are a reasonably priced option for this and a quick solution. Amazon have plenty of options as well as the larger supermarkets.
- Clothing: Please remember we offer a wide variety of learning experiences and your child will be getting opportunities to learn in our sandpit, digging area and creative areas which can all be a little messy! To comply with the Early Years Curriculum, we have to allow your children to choose their learning experiences and therefore it would not be appropriate for us to stop them engaging in their chosen areas of activity. We recommend clothing worn to nursery school is not expensive, or their best outfits.
- Attendance: while we appreciate that many of our families have not been able to see close family members for the last two years due to the COVID restrictions, we would ask you to carefully consider taking your child out of nursery during term time.

Nursery School education offers important opportunities for young children's development and learning, these opportunities are ones not easily replicated in the home environment. These opportunities include developing the depth and breadth of speaking and listening skills, building relationships, challenging and offering wide experiences in developing an understanding of mathematical concepts and core literacy skills to name a few. Research shows that children who regularly attend early years education perform better academically later on in their educational journey.
