It has been a real pleasure meeting your children and seeing how settled and confident they are within the nursery routines. They are a joy to spend time with.


I strongly believe in working in partnership with parents and carers and welcome your ideas and feedback as we move forward together. I look forward to getting to know you all over the coming weeks.


Our book for the next two weeks is Handa's Surprise.
