







Progress Related to Starting Points for Children Who Receive Early Years Pupil Premium When Compared to Children Who Do Not Receive Early Years Pupil Premium.


The small cohort size (7 children) distorts the statistical relevance of this data especially considering the fact that this cohort included a child with an Education and Health Care Plan.






Physical Development

The proportion of pupil premium children achieving outstanding progress is higher than non-pupil premium children across all areas of the curriculum. Pupil premium children made slower progress in Communication and Language, with only 57% making outstanding progress.
